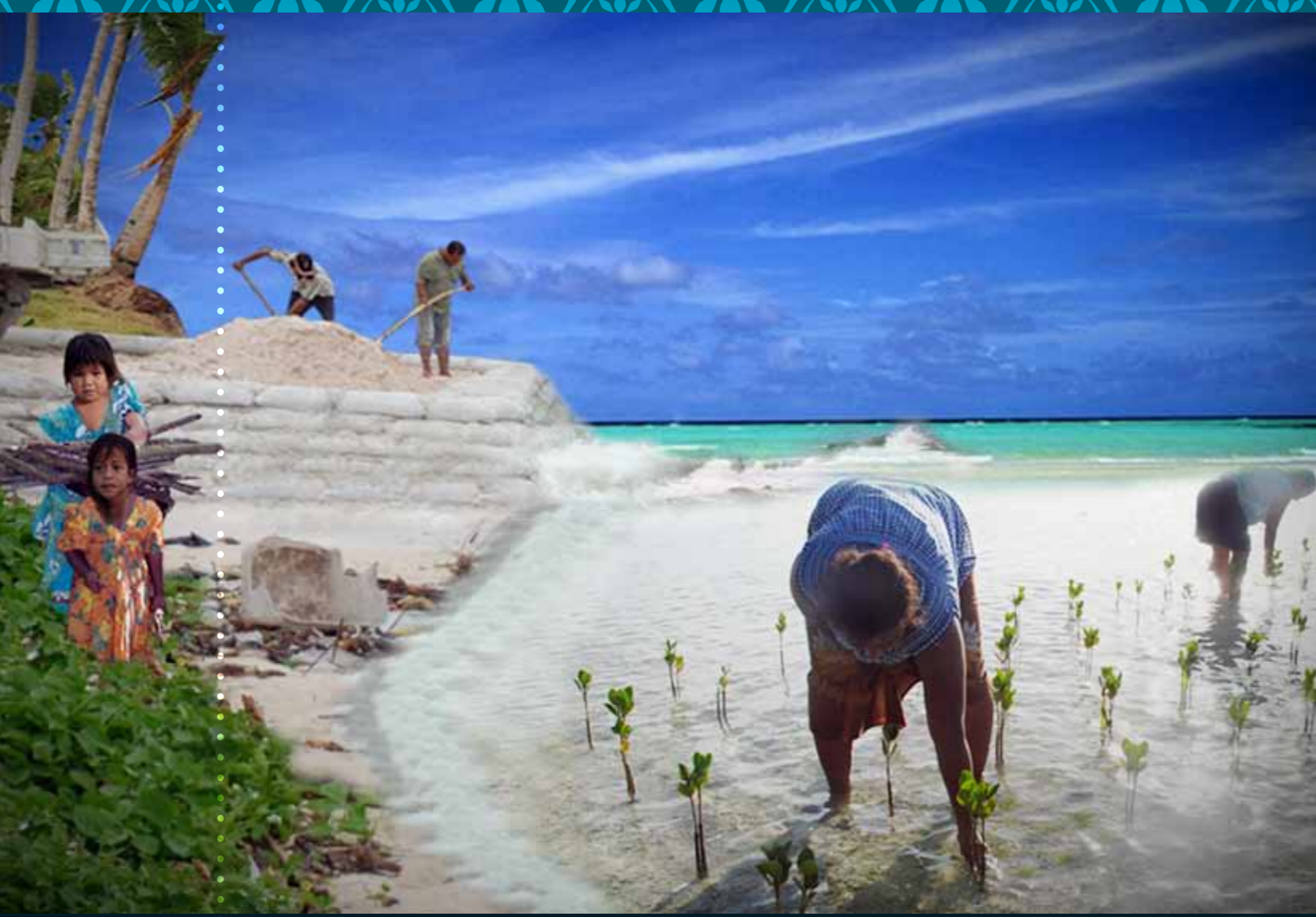


# Gender in Adaptation and Low Carbon Development in Small Island States of Pacific Islands
